Brief Summary of General Liability Insurance Program

The U.S. Rotary Club & District General Liability Insurance Program ("Program") was implemented to provide clubs and districts within the United States coverage for their legal liability arising out of bodily injury to a non-insured person or damage to a non-insured person's property. In addition to general liability coverage, this program also provides "liquor liability" for damages arising from selling, servicing or furnishing alcoholic beverages to a non-insured party, as well as "non-owned and hired automobile liability" which covers your legal liability to a non-insured party arising out of the maintenance or use of a hired or non-owned auto. Please note that non-owned and hired automobile liability coverage is excess over all primary insurance on the hired or non-owned vehicle.

The Program **does not** provide the following types of insurance coverage, nor can they be added on to the existing policy:

- Directors and Officers Liability (D&O)
- Crime Coverage a.k.a. Fidelity Bond or Employee Dishonesty Bond
- Property
- Auto Collision/Comprehensive coverage i.e. physical damage for non-owned, hired, leased or borrowed automobiles

Coverage is provided for claims that occur worldwide as long as the claim is brought (or legal suit is filed) in the United States, including its territories and possessions, and Canada. However, the territory for Non-Owned/Hired Automobile coverage is limited **only** to the United States, including its territories and possessions, and Canada.

In addition to your club or district, the following organizations are also insureds: Interact, Rotaract, Rotary Community Corps, Youth Exchange, Group Study Exchange, RYLA, and club and district foundations. Some of the organizations that are **not covered** under this policy are Provisional Rotary clubs, Fellowships, Inner Wheel clubs, Gift of Life organizations, and Youthact or Earlyact organizations. Please note that this is not an exhaustive list of covered and excluded organizations.
