Interact is a Rotary sponsored service club for young people ages (1)____ to _____. It gives young people an opportunity to participate in fun, meaningful service projects while developing leadership and meeting new friends.

Rotary International has more than (2)_____ Interact Clubs in some 117 countries with an estimated membership of 220,000 Interactors world wide. Interact was officially inaugurated on October 28, 1962. Since 1999 Interact Clubs have been recognized during “World Interact Week” every year during the week of (3)_____ to commemorate the founding of the first Interact Club. Each Interact Club must perform at least (4)_____ service projects a year, one to benefit the school or community and one that furthers international understanding. Interact clubs are required to meet at least twice a month with members to maintain attendance of (5)_____% or more.

WILL R. MANIER, JR – Memorial Scholarship Awards

Will R. Manier, Jr. served as President of the Nashville Rotary Club in 1921-22, District Governor 676 in 1923-24 and President of Rotary International in (1)_____ - _____. He was recognized as one of the outstanding leaders of the Rotary World. The Memorial Scholarship Awards were approved by our district in 1956 and has been awarding annually since then. Those eligible are any boy or girl residing in District 6760 who plans to enroll in an institution of higher education.

This is a one-time, one year scholarship in the amount of \$(2)_____. The district awards (3a)___ scholarships to(3b) ___ males and(3c) ___ females annually. Applications must be received by the local club by February 28 and after review each club may submit one male and one female to the district committee by March 15.
